DKG International Educators Foundation Grants DKGIEF supports effective educational projects and professional growth of educators worldwide. Two specific funds available for members to apply for professional development and educational degrees are opening soon.

Cornetet Individual Awards will fund participation in conferences, seminars, lecture series, online courses and workshops, plus other degree programs. Applications are due May 1 and September 1. The Apply button is available on the Cornetet page after logging in to the website.

Scholarship Funds awards 31 scholarships for members pursuing advanced degrees—\$6,000 for graduate studies and \$10,000 for doctorates. Those applications will be available on the website July 1 and are due by February 1.
