Membership News:



Chapter Meeting Minutes

February 9, 2022

The Gamma Sigma Chapter of Delta Kappa Gamma held a ZOOM meeting on February 9, 2022, with twelve members in attendance. Robyn introduced the guest speakers, Dr. Cherrel Miller Dyce from Elon University and Dr. Van Dempsey from the University of NC at Wilmington who were substituting for Anita.

Program: DRIVE: Develop a Representative and Inclusive Vision for Education –Educational Equity Dr. Dyce and Dr. Dempsey praised Anita for her work on the DRIVE Task Force, which began in January of 2020. There are 34 members of the Task Force representing public and private schools, the business sector and policy makers. Some aspects of the Task Force are to look at who is teaching, retention of teachers, and why teachers have left the profession. The more racial diversity of teachers will have more successful outcomes. Teachers of color impact all K - 12 students when they are taught by one teacher of color. Dr. Dempsey stressed that we will all benefit from equity driven decisions.

In January of 2020, the Task Force presented their plan to increase diversity in K-12 public schools. There are long-, mid-, and short-term strategies. Colleges and universities that offer education degrees will have to evaluate their programs. For more information, please go to


Business Meeting: The minutes from our December 4, 2021, were approved. Becky presented the Treasurer's Report showing a balance of \$1721.80 with no expenditures. Becky will check with Anita about donating \$100 split between our two guest speakers.

Robyn reported that the Executive Board met on February 3, 2021, and it was agreed that due to COVID no members would attend the Convention this April in Asheville. If it is decided to also have a virtual convention, then members may choose to attend.

Our February Project will focus on donating snacks to boost the morale of teachers in our three Restart Schools: Aberdeen Elementary, Southern Middle, and Robbins Elementary. Becky will be in charge of the project and will distribute our gifts to the three schools. Members are asked to contribute \$5 or \$10 for this project. Becky will check into if this would be possible.

Wanda reminded members that the deadline for nominating potential new members is April 12, and we will vote at our last Gamma Sigma meeting for the year.

The Nominating Committee of Robyn, Linda, and Wanda will be calling members asking them to take a leadership role for 2022 – 2024. Members are asked to consider saying yes to serve our chapter. We will vote on the slate of officers in March and install them during the April 12 meeting.
