Tambra Place

Gamma Sigma wants to thank our member, Tina Ganis for her service as the vice chair of this nonprofit that provides transitional housing for some homeless individuals. Moore County already has a Tambra Place for young women and soon homeless young men will have the same opportunity to live in a safe haven for a period of time. The new home in the Eastwood Community will house up to four young men and a resident adviser.

Tina is responsible for the wonderful article that was printed on the front page of "The Pilot" on March 19. Now others in our community will know of these two homes for young homeless women and men. Tambra Place is named in honor of Tambra Chamberlain, who works with Moore County Schools with children who are homeless.

Tambra Place residents are between the ages of 18 to 24 and can stay in the home until they are 25. Tambra Place provides resources —health, education, welfare, counseling, and social skills. These youth are independent and self-sufficient, but due to age and lack of resources are experiencing homelessness. At our April 11 meeting, we are asking members to donate household items for the new young men's transitional home.

Member Spotlight

Muse of the Arts: Elaine Sills



Delta Kappa Gamma and Gamma Sigma are celebrating the golden jubilee of our member, Elaine Morgan Sills. Elaine joined DKG in 1973 as a member of PHI Chapter. Elaine's family was a family of educators with her parents, an aunt, and a cousin all being teachers. Elaine's older sister, Mary Alice Wicker was a media specialist at Carthage Elementary and joined DKG in 1972. How special that both their lives were dedicated to education in Moore County.

Elaine received her Bachelor of Music and Master of Music Degrees from the University of North Carolina at Greensboro. For nineteen years, Elaine was the music educator at the middle and elementary schools in Aberdeen. As an itinerant music teacher, she taught at all the schools in the Moore County System except for Pinecrest.

During Elaine's first year of teaching, she met and married Milton Sills who was also a teacher. Milton was a former principal at Aberdeen Elementary School and later served as the coordinator of staff development for Moore County Schools. For the past year Elaine and Milton's son, Morgan, has served as the Executive Producer for the Judson Theatre Company, NYC at Sandhills Community College.

Elaine was the Music specialist K-12 Music and Choral for both Moore County and Hoke County Schools. She taught students majoring in music as an adjunct professor at Saint Andrews Presbyterian College and Gardner Webb University. In 1990, Elaine was the founder of the NCMEA Elementary Honors Chorus and served as the chair from 1990 – 1999.

From an article in "The Pilot" in January 21, 1991 titled "In A New Role As Muse of the Arts," Elaine's new position was the arts educator for the 11 county Region 4 of the State Department of Public Instruction. Her entire life has been as an advocate for the visual arts, dance, music, and theater arts in the schools.

We honor Elaine for her service to our community by serving on the boards of the Moore County Arts Council, Friends of Weymouth, the Moore County Historical Society, Moore County Choral Society, and the NC Symphony. Elaine is an honorary life member of Brownson Presbyterian Women where she has also served as an elder and choir member.

Elaine, your Gamma Sigma sisters thank you for your passion to provide arts education in public schools to equip all students to develop all their potentials. You were part of that foundation for the strong arts programs that Moore County Schools provides for all students. You are our Muse and inspiration for the Arts in our schools and county. We celebrate your 50 years of membership in DKG Gamma Sigma and your willingness to serve as our First Vice President for Programs on the Executive Board!

Delta Sigma Gives to Adult Protective Services

In each county in North Carolina, the Department of Social Services is mandated to provide Adult Protective Services. This service is designed to protect the disabled adult who is abused, neglected, exploited, and in need of protection as defined by North Carolina state law. In December, Delta Sigma (Region X, Lincoln) members elected to provide holiday gifts for these "senior angels." Some items provided were blankets, gripper socks, soft snacks, sweat-suits or warm zip-up hoodies, large print word searches, crossword puzzles, adult coloring books, good quality lotion, body wash, and shampoo. All gifts were dropped off to DSS Adult Department social workers. Eighteen Delta Sigma members participated in this project, coordinated by member Jill Eaddy.
