Educators Book Award Winners

Unveiled Truth: Lessons I Learned Leading the International School of Kabul by Gail Goolsby is the winner of the 2020 Educators Book Award. In July 2005, Goolsby traveled to Afghanistan to serve as the first principal of the International School of Kabul. This book shares the joys and challenges of beginning a new school in a war-torn country with a male-dominated culture.

She is a member of the Beta Rho Chapter of Kansas State Organization of DKG.

Honorable mention winners are Suffrage: The Epic Struggle for Women's Right to Vote by Susan L. Poulson. Suffrage, in a highly readable and informative style, tells the story of the epic struggle

for women to gain the right to vote in the United States. Because DKG's founder, Annie

Webb Blanton, was a suffragette, this book will be of interest to members.

Think Like Socrates by Shanna Peeples. [She] gives insightful strategies and ideas for using questions effectively in teaching.

The Educators Book Award is given annually to a thought-provoking book with a global impact and serves to honor the work of women writing in the field of education. This year, 18 books were submitted that met the criteria. Submissions are now being accepted for the 2021 award. Responsibilities of the Committees

Finance Committee

The chapter president and treasurer serve as ex officio members of the Finance Committee.

- 1. Prepare the annual chapter budget and present it to the membership for approval at the first chapter meeting.
- 2. Complete a financial review biannually by the chair of Finance.

Membership

1. Plan Orientation for prospective members using the Society's Guide to Orientation, the Ceremonies book, and the Yearbook.

2. Initiate members at the first meeting of the year.

Yearbook/Directory

- 1. Obtain a current list of members from the treasurer.
- 2. Consult with the first vice president for meeting dates, locations, and programs.
- 3. Prepare and print the yearbook for the biennium. The yearbook should be distributed at the first meeting of the year.

Nominations

The chapter officers shall be a president, a first vice president for programs, a second vice president for membership, a recording secretary for chapter minutes, and a corresponding secretary, who is responsible for the Gamma Sigma Signal.

- 1. Recruit members to serve as chapter officers.
- 2. The chapter treasurer is selected by the chapter Executive Board each biennium, and the treasurer can serve longer than two terms.

Programs/Personal Growth

The first vice president serves as chair of the Programs/Personal Growth committee.

- 1. Plan programs for the biennium.
- 2. Contact all guest speakers.
- 3. Plan the members who will give the invocation and serve as hostesses for the meeting.

Personal Service

- 1. Send a single red rose to the member in case of a serious extended illness of a member.
- 2. Contact members who fail to attend meetings.
- 3. Notify a member's family that a memorial gift of \$25 has been donated to the Scholarship Fund in the event of the death of a member.

Holiday Bazaar

- 1. Secure a location for the meeting and plan the menu.
- 2. Contact Delta Rho.
- 3. Set up the room with the donated items, help draw and announce the winners of the raffle.

Scholarship/Recruitment Grant-In-Aid

- 1. Choose a grant recipient from among area high school seniors on a rotating basis from North Moore, Pinecrest, and Union Pines High Schools.
- 2. Contact the scholarship coordinator of the school so that students may be made aware of the availability of the grant-in-aid.
- 3. Select a recipient from the submitted applications using the chapter's criteria.

Educational Initiative

- 1. Decide on a project to support beginning teachers in Moore County Schools.
- 2. Collect gifts and distribute them to the beginning teachers.

Literacy

- 1. Promote literacy as an ongoing project.
- 2. Collect funds for the brag basket at each meeting to be split with World Fellowship.
- 3. Encourage volunteerism in literacy projects.

World Fellowship

- 1. Pass the World Fellowship basket at each meeting.
- 2. Share with members at each meeting how these funds help others in the world.

Every four years we have national, state, and municipal elections. In 2020 we will be voting in Presidential, US Senate, and Congressional races, as well as for our state governor, lt. governor, attorney general, auditor, commissioners of agriculture, insurance, labor, secretary of state, treasurer, and judges, state legislatures, county commissioners, and board of education. A full list of the candidates, party affiliation, and the specific areas for which they are running is on the Moore County Board of Elections website at www.moorecountync.gov/board-of-elections. This website offers information on absentee voting, deadlines to register, lists of the candidates, and early voting (with times and places). You can also find your precinct information for voting on November 3!
