In high school, she thought that she would like to become a physical therapist. After working in a group home for special needs adults during high school, her plans changed and her passion was to become a special education teacher.

Elaina is a graduate of East Carolina University where she earned her Bachelor of Science with a concentration in Learning Disabilities and Master of Arts in Special Education. For 17 years, she was the lead special education teacher at the Sandhills Children's Center. We congratulate her for her desire to work with children of all ages and abilities. While teaching in West Pine Elementary School, Gamma Sigma held a meeting in Elaina's classroom where she also had a sensory room for her students. We observed her gardening and other projects. At Elise Middle School, she uses real life experiences to teach her students about managing money. In 2021, she wrote a grant to fund a trip to the Immersive Van Gogh Exhibit in Charlotte, which was an amazing trip for all. She values her students and makes learning fun!

While teaching at both the elementary and middle schools, Elaina's passion has been "reverse inclusion." The general education population students are invited into her classroom to learn and work alongside students with varied abilities. As a result, there has been a growth of acceptance and empathy from both populations.

In 2020, Elaina was selected as the Moore County Schools Teacher for 2020. This has opened doors for her to attend meetings at the state level and serve as a member of the State Leadership Council.

Elaina is interested in traveling to Chile this summer with GoGlobal NC. She will learn strategies to use when working with her students. She is planning to take seeds from her classroom to students in Chile. She will then bring back seeds for classrooms in Moore County. Training will be held in the spring and in June, the group will travel to Chile. Elaina is raising the \$6500 for the cost for her trip.

Elaina is also a busy mom. Austin is now working at home to earn money to pay for flight school. Anya is a freshman at North Moore and is captain of her swim team.

Gamma Sigma is proud of Elaina and all her accomplishments. We celebrate Elaina for her dedication to education and belief that every student is special.
