## Membership Report

Membership Chair: Wanda Sweeney

Forms for recommendation for membership in Delta Kappa Gamma were available at our February 25 meeting. Members should be considering those who might be eligible for membership. To be considered for invitation for active membership, a woman educator must:

- Have had professional preparation.
- The new rule includes **no requirement** for amount of service as a professional educator in advance of the invitation, **nor** does it eliminate retired educators from the pool of eligible candidates.
- Have professional proficiency, with characteristics such as:
  - 1. Knowledge and skill in her area of educational work.
  - 2. Active participation in professional groups at local, state, regional, national, and/or international levels.
  - 3. Interest in professional growth revealed through reading, attending workshops, participating in educational travel and pursuing graduate study.
  - 4. Willingness to participate in professional research and investigation.
  - 5. Willingness to assume leadership responsibilities.
- Be a contributing member of her community.

Our chapter discussed the option of talking with prospective members prior to their recommendation in order to ensure their interest in joining Delta Kappa Gamma.

Recommendation for membership forms can be downloaded from the DKG website, which is <a href="www.dkg.org">www.dkg.org</a>. The form will be under Membership and is Form 11. If you need me to mail you a form, I will be happy to if you just let me know. The deadline for e-mailing me the name of your nominee is by Tuesday, March 25. Please bring the nomination Form 11 to our April 1 meeting. When talking with nominees, you might want to mention that the dues for their first year would be \$90 and there would be an additional cost for their keypins.

#### **Reinstatement of Former Members**

Please consider approaching former Gamma Sigma members and inviting them to be reinstated in our DKG Society. At one time, a member who dropped her DKG membership could only return if the chapter approved. Now a former member shall be reinstated to membership by the chapter receiving the request.

#### Delta Kappa Gamma Society Gamma Sigma Meeting Notes February 25, 2014

(re-scheduled from February 15, 2014) Moore County Board of Education

The meeting was called to order at 6:05 pm by President Sara Webster. Juanita Harbour presented the invocation.

**Approval of Minutes-** The previous meeting notes were approved without revision.

The Treasurer's Report was presented by Annette Blue. The current balance as of February 25, 2014 is \$1,635.82. This includes the \$2 per member payment forwarded to Headquarters as well as the proceeds from the bazaar. Several members who could not attend the bazaar made monetary contributions to the chapter. Please consider this if you are unable to attend the bazaar in the future. Discussion related to the President's Pin ensued. Annette indicated that the current price for a gold pin is about \$500, but a gold plated one could be purchased for about \$30. The current pin was passed down to Sara from Judy.
