Forms will be available for recommendation for membership in Delta Kappa Gamma at our February meeting. Members should be considering those who might be eligible. To be considered for invitation for active membership, a woman educator must:

- Have had professional preparation.
- The new rule includes **no requirement** for amount of service as a professional educator in advance of the invitation, **nor** does it eliminate retired educators from the pool of eligible candidates.
- Have professional proficiency, with characteristics such as:
 - 1. Knowledge and skill in her area of educational work.
 - 2. Active participation in professional groups at local, state, regional, national, and/or international levels.
 - 3. Interest in professional growth revealed through reading, attending workshops, participating in educational travel and pursuing graduate study.
 - 4. Willingness to participate in professional research and investigation.
 - 5. Willingness to assume leadership responsibilities.
- Be a contributing member of her community.

Our chapter decided that members can talk with prospective members prior to their recommendations in order to ensure their interest in joining Delta Kappa Gamma. The deadline for nominations will be on **April 4**, and then we will vote on new members at our last meeting of the year on **April 15**.

Reinstatement of Former Members

Please consider approaching former Gamma Sigma members and invite them to be reinstated in our DKG Society. At one time, a member who dropped her DKG membership could only return if the chapter approved. Now a former member shall be reinstated to membership by the chapter receiving the request.

Barbara Keller, the president of Delta Rho, called the group to order and introduced our special guest Emily Lucas, Region VI Director. Ms. Lucas spoke for a few minutes focusing the group on their "M &M's." She is encouraging all members to mentor to the personal needs of the chapter, whether it be helping members with children or doing small good deeds in general. Following an invocation and expression of devotion, Pamela Beal introduced the Temple Teens, directed by Tom Dalton, who delighted everyone with an upbeat musical presentation. They received a standing ovation!

At 11:05 A.M. the Gamma Sigma chapter business meeting was called to order by its president Sara Webster.

- Minutes Previous meeting notes were accepted without revisions.
- Treasurer's Report- Annette Blue noted the \$2 donation per member that was previously approved by the chapter. \$118 was submitted but only \$38 was collected. She requested that anyone who had not paid should add \$2 to the envelope for this project. She thanked those who have already paid. A 2014 budget was presented for review. The motion was made and seconded to accept the budget as drafted. The group voted and the budget was accepted.
- Correspondence--Kate Faw read notes from Pam Zell and Juanita Harbour. A reminder to all was made regarding the importance of signing in at each meeting.
- World Fellowship Kitty Appanaitis passed the basket for donations.
- Literacy Initiative-Peggy Olney shared information from her committee. They recommend that the \$500 in the budget be given to Robbins Elementary for continuation of the RIF program. They felt it might be advisable to contact other organizations to match our funds. The motion was made and seconded. A vote was taken, and the motion approved.
- The Laundromat initiative was also discussed. Lorna Clack explained that the two locations selected were in Vass and in Robbins. Members are encouraged to bring fun items related to literacy (crayons and coloring books, paper and pencil game books, etc.) to future meetings.
- Gladys Britt shared the importance of our flowers for those experiencing loss.
- The brag basket was passed by Peggy for literacy projects. Comments were made by Tambra Chamberlain regarding Friend to Friend, and kudos were given to Jane McPhaul for her assistance in booking the lovely location.
