## <u>Membership News</u> Chair: Wanda Sweeney

Forms will be available for recommendation for membership in Delta Kappa Gamma at our February meeting. Members should be considering those who might be eligible. To be considered for invitation for active membership, a woman educator must:

• Have had professional preparation.

- The new rule includes **no requirement** for amount of service as a professional educator in advance of the invitation, **nor** does it eliminate retired educators from the pool of eligible candidates.
- Have professional proficiency, with characteristics such as:
  - 1. Knowledge and skill in her area of educational work.
  - 2. Active participation in professional groups at local, state, regional, national, and/or international levels.
  - 3. Interest in professional growth revealed through reading, attending workshops, participating in educational travel and pursuing graduate study.
  - 4. Willingness to participate in professional research and investigation.
  - 5. Willingness to assume leadership responsibilities.
- Be a contributing member of her community.

Our chapter discussed the option of talking with prospective members prior to their recommendation in order to ensure their interest in joining Delta Kappa Gamma

It was also suggested that the leader for each team to call any one on their list who may not have been present and tell them how much we missed them at the meeting.

\*Scholarship – Dot McDonald explained program and provided details as to how to access the scholarships that are available. Feb. 1 deadline.

\*Literacy Initiative/Brag Basket-Peggy Olney requested more input from the group on ideas as to how to use the monies allocated for the literacy committee. Suggestions from the committee included calculators for classroom use, subscriptions for internet computer math programs for classroom use (committee will check on charges for programs such as First Math and/or Perennial Math), continuation of the RIF program (in the past only at Robbins and Aberdeen Elem. now open to all schools) Lorna Clack suggested adopting the first grade at two schools. Peggy acknowledged the need to continue the discussion and that there would be another committee meeting held and anyone interested should contact her. The discussion included advantages of the buying of books for children versus buying classroom libraries. Brag basket was passed.

Motion made to combine Literacy and Numeracy funds.-motion made, seconded and voted. Passed.

A report was made by Annette Blue on Lucille Leeman's health condition. Her book sale items will be donated to Hospitality House.
