Treasurer's Report

As Gamma Sigma begins another year it is my duty to collect the dues that must be sent to state and international and that enable us to accomplish our goals. Let me begin by saying that each of you is a valued and essential member of our chapter. We would not exist without the generous donation of your time and money.

At my request, the Executive Board has approved a change in the dues collection procedure. This change was prompted by the fact that last year it took me six months beyond the October 31 deadline to collect all the dues owed to our chapter. In years past, I have kept a member on our roster as long as they assured me they were sending their dues and wanted to remain a member. Because of what happened last year I can no longer continue that procedure. My report and dues are to be sent to the state treasurer postmarked no later than November 10th. If I do not have a member's dues by November 9th they will be dropped from our roster for non-payment of dues. If that happens the reinstatement process is very easy and I will do everything in my power to facilitate the process.

Active dues are \$80 plus \$2 for the State Headquarters Fund. Reserve dues are \$25 plus \$2 for the State Headquarters Fund. New member dues are \$90 (includes a \$10 initiate fee) plus \$2 for the State Headquarters Fund. Checks should be made to Gamma Sigma. Please understand that this is your first notice that your dues to Gamma Sigma chapter are due and payable. If I do not receive your dues on or before our September meeting I will contact you once to remind you that I have not received your dues. If you mail your dues to me I will respond by email or phone to let you know that I have received your check. We are all professional women. It is my responsibility to inform members about our dues and deadlines. It is the responsibility of each member to forward their dues to me. Thank you for your help with this process. I look forward to seeing you in September.

During the first week in June when I was in the mountains checking my email, I found a notice from Reading Is Fundamental that we had an opportunity to apply for a \$3800.00 grant from RIF and the Macy's 2015 Book Smart Campaign. We had to apply immediately so thanks to Nancy Simonette and computer technology, we got the application signed and were notified that we were awarded the money.

Since I had a doctor's appointment in Pinehurst on June 9, I scheduled a visit to Robbins Elementary to meet the new librarian and see if she could order the books (approximately 1900). She was very cooperative and immediately ordered the books so that we could meet the deadline.

The only problem was that I forgot to tell her to be sure to have the books delivered to the school. After I returned to the mountains, I got a notice that the books were being delivered...to my house! Thanks to some good friends whom I called on and a son-in-law who just happened to go by, the books were gathered up (12+ cartons) and put in the garage to stay dry. Thanks to some more help, they are all now at Robbins Elementary.

In order to fulfill the requirements of the grant, we will need to submit press releases, publicize the event with photos, distribute the books, and submit thank-you notes to the donor. **The RIF distribution is planned for Robbins Elementary for Friday, October 9, 2015!** I hope some of our Gamma Sigma members can be there to represent us and help with this project.
